

All Systems Permit Pavement Restriction Update Request

The All Systems Permit is an annual permit that allows for unlimited trips on all state and approved city/county roads which are categorized under the following maximum dimensions:

Maximum Dimensions for Legal Loads:

- Length: 120'
- Width: 16'
- Height: 15' 5"
- Gross Weight: 80,000 pounds
- Axle Weight: 20,000 pounds per axle

At certain dimensions within the allowed limits there are requirements to contact MCS for a route approval:

- 120' long x 12' 5" wide x 13' 10" high - unlimited distance - no routing required
- 120' long x 14' 6" wide x 15' 5" high - movement restricted to 50 mile radius unless the route continues on at least 4-lane roads or trip routes are obtained from Motor Carrier Services
- 120' long x 16' wide x 15' 5" high - trip routes must be obtained
- 75' long x 12' 5" wide x 14' 6" high - maximum dimensions for hauling hay

Carriers are required to check with local officials when traveling on county roads or city streets for bridge embargo, detour, road embargo and vertical clearance information.

This will help us to both assist the public and place the restrictions in a spatially correct location within the database. The restrictions noted on the current online maps will not be transferred to the new maps so you will need to provide all restrictions you want noted on the map.
