### AMBROSE A. CALL STATE PARK

A PARK whose walls of natural beauty in forest, wild flowers, shaded-licking meadows and upland views invites you to the banks of the east fork of the Des Moines River in Kosciusko County.

### BACKBONE STATE PARK

THE LARGEST of Iowa's State Parks with an acreage of 1,287 located in northwest Delaware County. Its limestone ridge, long since carved by spring fed streams, projects from a dense forest, many towering outlooks, pine covered heights and over interesting caverns which overlook the Maquoketa and give character to the park.

### BELLEVEU STATE PARK

ON THE MISSISSIPPI! At Bellevue in Jackson County, where part of the alluvial bottoms of Wolf Creek has been preserved with its abundant shade, prairie wild flowers and repositful landscape.

### BIXBY STATE PARK

SMALL AS state parks go, but abundant in nature's treasures of limestone rock outcrops, ice caves, ferns, wild flowers, and the forest, prairie, so characteristic of Clayton County.

### BLISS STATE PARK

IN THE heart of the state, where the waters of Wolf Creek have been preserved with its abundant shade, prairie wild flowers and repositful landscape.

### CENTREVILLE STATE PARK

RECENTLY acquired park area in Appanoose County, unimproved at this time but holding in store an inviting landscape for future enjoyment.

### DOLLIVER MEMORIAL STATE PARK

IN WESTER COUNTY—Dedicated to the memory of one of Iowa's illustrious statesmen—fittingly marked by a bronze tablet from the hand of Lorenzo Tappan—outstanding in beauty, character and scenic interest.

### EAGLE LAKE STATE PARK

DICING PATRIOTS, naturalists, fishermen and hunter find it equally charming, inviting and beautiful. Near U.S. Highway 18 in Hancock County.

### ELBERT STATE PARK

ON THE ALLUVIAL bottoms of the Des Moines River, in Polk County, lies a favorite picnic spot—easily accessible. It contains 261 acres.

### ELDON PINE CREEK STATE PARK

ENCLOSING picturesque Pine Lake with its state plant life, interesting sandstone and topographic features, popular swimming, boating and golf. Reached easily from Iowa Primary Road to 118 east of Eldon in Hardin County.

### ELMORE STATE PARK

IDEAL combination for scenery, nature, lakes or active play.

### FARMINGTON STATE PARK

CROSS THE Des Moines River to the town of Farmington in Van Buren County. Within its 102 acres of land are to be found that jewel of the southeast, Dark Lake, and hills rich in rare ferns, wild flowers and birds—Made easy to enjoy by shelter and picnic developments, shaded winding trails and harmonizing bridges.

### FLINT HILLS STATE PARK

ONCE THE haunt of Indian tribes who secured their materials from arrow heads, Flint Hills are a piece of landscape located in Des Moines County, north of Burlington. Picnic spots on high tree cliffs, an excellent golf course and ample opportunity for nature hikes.

### FORT ATKINSON STATE PARK

IN WINNEBAGO COUNTY—Historical remnants of a once active site erected in 1840 for protection of warning Indian tribes. Visit block houses and the magazine house—many of the shaded lawns and tree framed views.

### FORT DEFENSE STATE PARK

HISTORICAL IN background, recalling the many difficulties of the early settlement of the Indian land, Fort Defense is a fine example of the early fort built against the Indians. A park that has been enlarged to 200 acres and improved with surfaced drives, a large shade building, covered walkways and modern picnic conveniences. Shaded forested valleys, expansive views over the hills, intimate touch with Iowa's birds and excellent opportunities for the study of glacial deposits. —These await you at Fort Defense.

### GITCHIE MANITO STATE PARK

ITERALLY the corner stone of Iowa, situated in the extreme northwest corner of the state and characterized by a rare rock-bound pool—laser pool—where rare tinted rock shores, dwarfed oaks, cacti and gnarled cedars form a pleasing picture. This area, famed as the only Iowa exposure of Sioux quartzite, the oldest rock in the state.

### KING TRACT STATE PARK

A FASCINATING wooded area in Guthrie County, northeast of Guthrie. It contains remnants of the pioneer interests of 1848—furns and barns of scientific interest and pleasant picnic groves.

### LAKEY-KEOSAUQUA STATE PARK

THE second largest state park in Iowa covers 1222 acres of land in Van Buren County bordering the Des Moines River for five miles. The park is named in honor of Keosauqua, a tree which grows in the crevices of the river, covering the Indian mounds old Indian camp grounds, and a large shade building, covered walkways and modern picnic conveniences. Shaded forested valleys, expansive views over the hills, intimate touch with Iowa's birds and excellent opportunities for the study of glacial deposits. —These await you at Fort Defense.
