CIVIL RIGHTS IN IOWA—All persons shall be entitled to full and equal enjoyment of the accommodations, privileges and advantages of all public facilities. Any person denying the aforesaid rights or imposing conditions in such denial shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not exceeding \$100 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days.



Newest service to motorists on Iowa's expanding Interstate highway network is a chain of modern shelters and restrooms with picnic facilities. The eight new buildings will be located at nine pairs of safety rest areas now open to Interstate traffic. When completed in the summer of 1966, the safety rest areas will offer restroom and picnic facilities to motorists using Iowa's Interstate.

COVER PICTURE

Iowa's longest and highest highway bridge was opened to traffic last year. The 5,645-foot bridge, on Iowa Highway 14 in Marion County, reaches 85 feet above the Des Moines River. Built to span a lake to be formed by the Red Rock Dam seven miles downstream, the new bridge will carry two lanes of traffic and offer motorists a panorama of Iowa's scenic Des Moines River valley. Completion of the dam is expected in 1966, creating a 8,000-acre lake 15 miles long.
