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What is the intended benefit of the rule?

The intended benefit of Chapter 410 is to provide information on special mobile equipment (SME) for customers in two main areas: (1) titling and registering SME and (2) requirements when transporting SME on a registered vehicle. These rules provide transparency on some of the common scenarios that arise for customers who own or transport SME.

Is the benefit being achieved? Please provide evidence.

Yes. The rules allow a customer with SME permanently attached to a motor truck, trailer, or semitrailer to obtain registration and title for the motor truck, trailer, or semitrailer. Allowing registration and title in this situation benefits customers because some states require title and registration for special mobile equipment to transfer ownership or operate in the other state. Although the volume of titles and registrations issued under this chapter is quite small, less than 20 annually, it is a valuable option for the customers who need it.

Additionally, the rules give clear guidance to customers and law enforcement on the interaction between lowa Code section 321E.12 and lowa Code chapter 321 when SME is being transported on a vehicle registered according to the gross weight of the registered vehicle, not including the load. Clearly specifying that size and weight limitations of lowa Code chapter 321 continue to apply unless a permit is obtained under chapter 321E and requiring a copy of the lease agreement (if applicable) to be carried in the vehicle, helps avoid unnecessary enforcement actions. The Department issued 10,144 permits for vehicles carrying special mobile equipment that exceed the size and weight limits in calendar year 2023.

What are the costs incurred by the public to comply with the rule?

There are no costs to the general public because of this chapter. Rather, the rules provide the option for certain SMEs to obtain title and registration, which greatly benefits a customer seeking to transfer ownership of the SME or operate the SME in another state. The rules also clarify the statutory size and weight requirements for customers transporting special mobile equipment, which helps customers avoid unnecessary enforcement actions.

What are the costs to the agency or any other agency to implement/enforce the rule?

There are no costs to the Department under these rules. While the permit issuance and title and registration processes in general do require staff time, those costs are already required by statute.

Law enforcement agencies incur fewer costs to enforce the chapter since it clearly specifies expectations when transporting SME.

Yes. The rules impose no costs, rather the rules provide benefits to customers by increasing transparency regarding title, registration, and transportation of SME.

The Department reviewed the registration requirements in neighboring states for SME and found lowa's neighboring states are either the same or more restrictive than lowa's law.				
 Kentucky and Minnesota are similar to Iowa, in that they do not require SME to be titled and registered. On the other hand, Missouri, Indiana, Wisconsin, Michigan, and Illinois are more restrictive than Iowa because these states require registration of SME (though the registration fees are discounted).
